The Ziggurat Model: Planning Comprehensive Behavioral Interventions for Individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder

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Training Outline

The Ziggurat Group specializes in evaluation and intervention of autism spectrum disorder. Comprehensive Program Planning with *The Ziggurat Model and Comprehensive Autism Planning System:*

The Ziggurat Group provides intensive training in comprehensive program planning for individuals with ASD. The Ziggurat Model and the Comprehensive Autism Planning System (CAPS) provide a unique process and framework for designing comprehensive interventions for individuals of all ages with autism spectrum disorder. The Ziggurat Model and CAPS promote collaboration and communication among parents, adolescents and adults with ASD, and professionals.

The goal of training is to make a difference in the lives of those with ASD by preparing participants to utilize the Ziggurat Model and CAPS in their daily practice. The training materials and methods ensure that both novice and experienced staff gain knowledge and skills that they can immediately use. Trainers employ hands-on team activities and case examples with immediate coaching and feedback to increase the participants' experience in using the Ziggurat Model and CAPS. Throughout the training, there is an emphasis on evidenced-based practices and fidelity in implementation.

Training Objectives:

Participants will be able to:

- Discuss leading theories regarding the signs and symptoms of autism
- Use specially designed assessment tools to identify the relationship of underlying characteristics of ASD with observable behavior:
 - A survey of underlying characteristics (UCC)
 - A survey of individual strengths and skills (ISSI)

- List five areas required for a comprehensive intervention
- Identify research validated strategies for intervention on each of the five levels of the Ziggurat
- Use the Ziggurat Worksheet to plan a comprehensive intervention
- Describe the CAPS Model and how Ziggurat and CAPS work together
- Participate effectively as a team member
- Identify common pitfalls in intervention design for individuals with ASD

Suggested Workshop Sequence:

Training can be accomplished in a two or three-day workshop. The first two days provide participants with the background in the model. Coaching is an effective way to support participants as they begin to use the Ziggurat Model. Coaching can be accomplished in-person and/or via conferencing. The training sequence is described below:

TRAINING OPTION

Train the Trainer: Certified Ziggurat Trainer:

The Certified Ziggurat Trainer program is ideal for organizations that seek to build capacity while supporting fidelity and use of the Ziggurat Model. At the end of the training sequence, the host agency will have a large pool of staff members who have been trained in the use Ziggurat Model and eight to twelve Certified Ziggurat Trainers (CZTs). *Certified Ziggurat Trainers* are qualified to consult with and to train staff in their employment setting in the use of the Ziggurat Model. This is the best way to create systems change.

Suggested Workshop Sequence:

The host agency selects up to 8 staff members to become CZTs. Potential trainers attend a full seven day sequence. The following qualities are recommended when selecting future trainers:

- Knowledge of autism spectrum disorders
- Knowledge of effective interventions for individuals with ASD
- Knowledge and application of the Ziggurat Model
- The ability to facilitate others in using the Ziggurat Model

Training is accomplished in two trips. The first trip (briefly summarized below) is two or three days as described above. On the second trip, the first day is dedicated to CZTs only while the following training days are identical to the initial three training days. The CZTs help to facilitate activities on the two (or three) training days and have the opportunity to gain a deeper understanding of the Ziggurat Model. Additionally, the trainers learn how best to present the material in future trainings that they will conduct. Please note, there is no limit to the number of participants who may attend the training. Including a large audience helps to build an initial pool of staff who are familiar with the comprehensive planning process. The full training sequence is detailed below.
